The US-based Project Management Institute (PMI) approved Rwanda Management Institute (RMI) as a Registered Education Provider (R.E.P) since January 1st, 2020. The license has been renewed effective April 20th, 2021. RMI is pleased to inform its clients, partners, stakeholders and the general public that it provides training of Project Management Professional (PMP®) program from all its campuses & centers.

So far 89 senior officials from different Ministries and Districts have attended the PMP® training at RMI; starting from the previous training of June 2021 that attracted 27 Districts and MINALOC senior officials, during 2019-2020 fiscal year, RMI provided PMP® training to 31 Senior Officials from Ministry of Finance and Economic Planning (MINECOFIN), eight from Ministry of Education (MINEDUC) and one from Ministry of Defense (MINADEF) while 2018-2019 fiscal year, RMI provided the same training to 12 employees of Senate of Rwanda and to 10 senior officials from the Prime Minister's office (PRIMATURE).

Friday 04th June 2021, Ministry of Local Government (MINALOC) senior officials namely Permanent Secretary, SPIU Coordinator, Chief Digital Officer with 22 District Executive Secretaries and Corporate Service Division Managers of Kigali City and Rusizi District who are also the Chief Budget Managers(CBMs) complete the Project Management Professional (PMP®) training that has been taking place at RMI Murambi Campus since May 31st, 2021 with the aim of strengthening their capacity in project management and share needed skills in the execution of strategic government projects.

36 RDRC staff completed training of psycho-social support to survivors of SGBV, forced marriage and human trafficking at RMI



Mr. Kizito HABIMANA (Left), the RMI Deputy Director General presided over the closing ceremony of a 5-day training of psycho-social support to survivors of Sexual and Gender Based Violence(SGBV), forced marriage and human trafficking that attracted 36 staff from Rwanda Demobilization and Reintegration Commission (RDRC) in two sessions at RMI Muhima Campus. The first session of 17 staff took place from 24th to 28th May 2021 while the second one started from May 31st, 2021 to June 04th, 2021 with 19 members of staff.

During the closing ceremonies of two sessions, Mr. HABIMANA appreciated the zeal and discipline of RDRC staff who attended the training as they actively participated to gain the expected knowledge and skills. He commended RDRC's culture following the previous trainings RMI held in partnership with RDRC.

He also urged training participants to always keep learning to be creative and innovative in their daily duties.
