In partnership with KIPA through KOICA, RMI held a High Level Video Conference E-learning Program



On Thursday 20th September, 2018, Hon. Rwanjindo Kayirangwa Fanfan, Minister of Public Service and Labour attended the High Level Video Conference (HLVC) on RMI Muhima e-learning Center where RMI and Korea Institute of Public Administration (KIPA) presented the implementation progress of the ICT supported Human Resources development and public service capacity building project.

Mr. GASAMAGERA Wellars, the RMI Director General said that the e-learning program will help RMI beneficiaries to access training in a cost effective mode.

“RMI has undertaken the long journey to modernize our training approach aiming at better access to our

programs in a cost effective manner yet caring about quality improvement. We want to inspire, impact and renew.” He said

Hon. Minister Rwanjindo Kayirangwa Fanfan also thanked the Republic of Korea for supporting this project and appreciated its implementation progress.

This project mainly focused on an e-learning component through the installation of IT equipment and systems in the RMI six e-learning remote center including MUSANZE, KAYONZA, NYANZA, KARONGI, MUHIMA in Kigali and MURAMBI in Muhanga District.

Among others, the event was attended by H.E. Kim Eung-joong, Ambassador of Korea Republic to Rwanda, LEE BYUNG HWA, the Country Director of KOICA Rwanda and Mr. Hyug Keun Ahn, Vice President of KIPA.

25 participants completed the GoR Investment Promotion Training
